How it works:

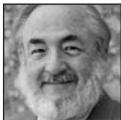

This seminar focuses on two important components of the legal aspects of municipal procedure - a municipality's interaction with the County and employment and disciplinary issues.

The 21 counties in New Jersey have powers that affect many of the operations of municipal government. Counties affect everything from parking and speed limits to signs, signals and repair of local roads. It is crucial for attorneys who represent municipalities, municipal employees or parties suing those entities to understand when a municipality does-or does not-have control over local issues.

These municipal experts will also analyze employment, discipline and discrimination as applied to New Jersey municipalities.
